- Remove any leaf or yard waste from the property as it can Begin a professionally managed tick abatement program serve as a major harborage for ticks
- Spread any dense stands of perennials to increase air flow. Ticks require environmental moisture to survive
- Keep the lawn mowed on a regular interval to prevent tall grass

- Remove tall grass/brush from the edge of the property and gardens
- Install a 6-to-10 foot band of untreated wood chips around the edge of wooded areas
